Bulletin of World Report on the Culture of Peace for November 2007 -January 2008

Dear Friends,

The Global Youth Solidarity Fund took another step forward when it was formally adopted this month as one of the main decisions of the first forum of the United Nations initiative for Alliance of Civilizations. The forum was held in Madrid, Spain the 15th and 16th of January.

A number of global youth organizations met prior to the Alliance forum and took part in it. As quoted in the CPNN article (see below), Christopher Derige Malano, delegate from the International Movement of Catholic Students, said "I was pleased to see the optimism of civil society, religious leaders and private sector representatives, as well as diplomats, and their commitment to build a culture of peace. I felt that our opinions as youth were heard with respect, even if our ideas were not always included in the agenda-setting of the forum. For example, in the future there could be more attention to the kinds of communication used by the majority of youth who are not involved with formal organizations or media, e.g. street art, internet groups and networks, etc. Ultimately, it is comforting to know that our collective contributions at the Forum were a step in the right direction."

Jo Lofgren, who worked with me and others on the original proposal for the Youth Solidarity Fund, is now working at the Alliance of Civilizations, and we expect to hear more about the Fund in the coming months. Youth initiatives continue to top the list of activities for the Global Movement for a Culture of Peace. They will be considered here by continent followed by the relevant articles in the Culture of Peace News Network, http://cpnn-world.org.

ARAB STATES

In Egypt, 1200 participants, mostly youth, took part in the International Youth Forum in Sharm El Sheikh. The Arab version of the Youth Report on the Culture of Peace was distributed and very well received, and hopefully we will be hearing much more from the youth of this region in the future. Bulletin of World Report on the Culture of Peace for July-August 2007

Dear Friends,

It is the youth, the next generation, that is now taking the lead in the Global Movement for a Culture of Peace.

I've had the privilege of participating in several youth-led initiatives which have been described in recent CPNN articles.

One is the United Nations advocacy group of recent graduates of the University of Peace (see http://cpnn-world.org/cgi-bin/read/articlepage.cgi?ViewArticle=352). The initiative was conceived and managed by Nick Martin, one of the young people who took part in last year's culture of peace advocacy group at the United Nations. Learning from that previous experience, he and his fellow UPEACE graduates improved upon the methods that had been used last year.

Another is the recent Global Youth Assembly that was held in Edmonton, Canada, under the auspices of the John Humphrey Center for Peace and Human Rights. It is described by Aliaa El zeiny, one of the Assembly delegates, in the recent CPNN article at http://cpnn-world.org/cgi-bin/read/articlepage.cgi?ViewArticle=361. The Assembly was organized by a group of young people at the Center, including Renee Vaugeois and Kiran Choudhry.

As pointed out in the article by Aliaa, and as stressed during the training session of the UPEACE group, one of the important challenges is to maintain the momentum achieved during these mobilizations so that participants can remain active and connected with each other and with the Global Movement as a whole. This will be tested again at the upcoming International Youth Forum, "Youth Speak - We Listen! Voices for Peace", sponsored by the Suzenne Mubarak Women's International Peace Movement in Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt, where Aliaa and I will meet again as well as a number of other youth who have already been working for an Arab Youth Network for the Culture of Peace. Thanks to the generous support of Federico Mayor and his Fundacion Cultura de Paz, the Youth Report on the Culture of Peace will be translated into Arabic and published and disseminated to the youth delegates in Sharm El Sheikh. Once it is available the Arabic version will also be uploaded onto the Decade website.

I am pleased to announce a new website (http://cpnn-world.org) designed to report the good news that you have been sending us on the advances toward a culture of peace. This website is essential because your good work is seldom reported by the mass media, which focuses on war and violence. The new website is based on a previous website of the Culture Of Peace News Network (http://cpnn-usa.org) which we have maintained for several years for the United States).

The new website is simple to use:

- * Write a 300-400 word news report
- * Respond to comments by a moderator who will check your report for clarity or
- * Register for DiscussionBoard (takes 24 hours)
- * Log in to the Discussion Board to post your comments on any report

Since the World Civil Society Report on the Culture of Peace was completed in 2005, many of you have sent me updates about the good work that your organization continues to do for a culture of peace. As you know we made a website for mass media reports of the culture of peace at http://decade-culture-of-peace.org/news/cgi-bin/ib4/ikonboard.cgi. Now we don't have to wait for the mass media, but you can publish your information directly on the new website.

Please go to http://cpnn-world.org and write your own news report about events or media that promote a culture of peace. It may be something that you and your organization have done, or something that your read or saw in the media that promotes one or more aspects of a culture of peace (human rights, democratic participation, understanding, tolerance and solidarity, sustainable development, free flow of information, equality of women, peace education or disarmament).

Also add your comments to the DiscussionBoard which already hundreds of questions that have already been raised. Your comments may be on your own story or to any story previously submitted.

If your news report cannot be stated in only 300-400 words, then you should send it to us in two parts. The first part, a summary of 300-400 words, will be used as a news report, and the rest of the report will be put on the DiscussionBoard.

As we begin the new website, news reports must be in English, while discussion may be in any language. Hopefully, by the end of the year we can also allow French and Spanish for the news reports. And in a few years we hope to have other websites in other language scripts. A Japanese site already exists at http://www.cpnn.net and there is discussion for an Arabic site.

February/March 2007 Bulletin of World Report on the Culture of Peace

Dear Friends,

Youth teams for a culture of peace are now being developed in the Arab region.

This new process was advanced during the week of February 26-March 3 2007 at the Second Annual Arab Youth Forum and Fourth Annual Arab Reform Conference which were organized and hosted by the Bibliotheca Alexandrina in Alexandria, Egypt. Along with Jo Lofgren, who was a member of the 2005 UN Youth Advocacy Team, I was invited to take part in order to work with the new youth team for the culture of peace which has now been established at the Bibliotheca. The team includes Hagar Ibrahim who took part in the 2006 Youth Advocacy Team at United Nations (see Bulletin for November/December 2006). Among other members of the team are Ahmed Ragab Al-Kotby and Suzan Adel. Together we worked to engage other youth at the two meetings. This was productive and led to a linkage with the Arab Network of Young Peacebuilders that has been organized by Naoufal El Hammoumi from Morocco.

The work was greatly helped by an Arab translation and publication of the Midterm Civil Society Report which is now available on our website. This was produced by the Bibliotheca Alexandrina with support from the Fundacion Cultura de Paz.

The Bibliotheca Youth Team plans to design several projects at the regional level, as well as engaging other youth in Egypt. At the same time, we are all working together to ensure that Arab youth are well represented in future advocacy work in international meetings.
