Bulletin of World Report on the Culture of Peace for May/July 2008

Dear Friends,

There are two subjects in this bulletin: 1) update on the Culture of Peace News Network (CPNN) and 2) the results of the first Youth Solidarity Fund grants.

CPNN

Regarding CPNN, I must ask if the recent reduction in articles reflects a true reduction in work for a culture of peace, or does it mean that you are not thinking of sending in articles about the work that you are doing? Last year at this time there were 15 new articles listed on the CPNN website (http://cpnn-world.org), but this year there have been only five in recent months.

In any case, you are invited to send in a brief article on your organization's work, using the CPNN submission page at http://cpnn-world.org/write/submitart.html . If possible, please send a photograph or other image directly to our email address below.

One aspect of CPNN has become easier. If you wish to register and contribute to the ongoing discussions of CPNN articles, you no longer need to wait for verification. A new system is put in place that allows you to register, log-in and contribute immediately.

YOUTH SOLIDARITY FUND

The United Nations Alliance of Civilizations initiative has announced the seven winners of the first round of small grants for youth-led projects. The announcement was made on July 10 and is available on the AoC website at

As readers of the Bulletin know, the Youth Solidarity Fund was announced at the Alliance of Civilizations Forum in Madrid in January 2008 and aims to provide seed funding (in amounts up to \$20,000) to outstanding youth-led projects aiming to enhance intercultural and interreligious dialogue.

The call for applications was launched in February 2008 and the announcement of the first round of funded projects was made to the successful applicants on June 24, 2008. Youth played a critical role in the selection process; an international team of seven young people was called upon to review submitted project proposals and make recommendations for funding.

The winning projects are as follows:

* Speaking and Listening with Respect: Students, Faith, and Dialogue, led by the International Movement of Catholic Students � Pax Romana

* Embracing Diversity and Nurturing Understanding through the Empowerment of Women for Political Leadership, led by the International Union of Socialist Youth

* The Role of Youth as Citizens in the Construction of an Intercultural Society, led by the

Argentinean Youth Organization for the United Nations

* God and Me, led by No Ghetto, France

* Capacity Building for Youth Leaders of Religious and Traditional Groups on Tolerance and Cultural Diversity for Sustained Peace and Development in Ghana, led by the Federation of Youth Clubs, Ghana

* Capacity Building for Youth Leaders and Strengthening Youth Networking for Peace Building, led by Generation Peace Youth Network, Philippines

* Interethnic Youth Alliance, led by the Cultural Center DamaD, Serbia

Brief descriptions of the seven organizations are provided on the AoC website, and more detailed project descriptions will be made available at a later time in an annex.

It is important that these projects are successfully carried out and evaluated, so that the Fund can be expanded and support a greater number of activities in future years.

Bulletin of World Report on the Culture of Peace for February/April 2008

Dear Friends,

As mentioned in the previous bulletin, the first stage of the Youth Solidarity Fund is now in progress. The announcement is available (in English only) on the website of the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations initiative at the page http://www.unaoc.org/content/view/93/128/lang,english/ .

The aim of the Fund is to identify the best proposals for intercultural youth dialogue that will build bridges between diverse youth groups where such bridges are really needed to overcome divides and defuse tensions. This announcement pertains to the pilot phase of the Fund and only a small number of entirely youth-led projects will be awarded seed funding in amounts up to \$20,000. The following thematic areas are included in the pilot phase:

* Intercultural and Interreligious Exchanges

- * Youth Leadership Training
- * Youth Voices in the Media

The deadline for applications is April 30

In speaking with Jo Lofgren, who is developing the Fund for the Alliance, I learned that there are only enough funds for a few grants in this first round, and that as soon as the deadline was announced, their office was flooded with far more requests than can be funded. Therefore, Jo asks that any organisation considering applying to the Fund carefully considers the application criteria and guidelines

A good side of this is that it shows the enormous interest of youth organizations to work for a culture of peace. It also signals the need for more fund-raising so there can be more projects supported in the future rounds.

Another good side is that an important role in the funding process is being played by a Youth Advisory Council that has just been established by the Alliance. This was one of the chief recommendations in Youth Report on the Culture of Peace in which many of you participated (see the Youth Report at <u>http://decade-culture-of-peace.org</u>).

Even though there are only a few awards available for this first round, it is important that are successful so that we can prove that youth organizations, when given the opportunity, are ready to make important contributions to the culture of peace.
